

Notes from Philanthropy

Hello Quilters!

In April we received 8 finished quilts, 7 cosmetic bags, and 2 tote bags! Thank you all so much for the support you give to Philanthropy each month!

April Philanthropy Donations



One of the questions we are frequently asked is "what size quilts do you like to receive?", and the simple answer is "we like every size and we always find a home for every quilt we receive!".

Our favorite sizes and types of quilts would be the categories listed below. We give an infant and an adult lap quilt to each new mom at St. Clares Maternity home. We also donate to agencies that support children and young adults in crisis, and always have a need for kid's quilts, especially boy-themed and teen-appropriate designs. When you are making a quilt top for Philanthropy, if possible, it helps us if the width of the top is around 40" so we can use 44-45" backing. We rely on donated fabric for our backings and rarely have wide backing available, and are also limited on donations of larger lengths of fabric that could be cut and piece for a backing.

Philanthropy Quilt Sizes

Infants and Baby "Tummy Time" quilts	36-40" W X 36-42" L
Toddlers through Pre-school	36-40" W X 45-48" L
Kid's Quilts (ages 6 -Teen)	40-45" W X 48-50 " L
Adult Comfort Lap Quilt	46-52" W X 58-62" L
Adult Throw Quilt	54-60" W X 64-74" L


