Guild Matters:

We need a nominating committee of 7 members to fill our board positions for next year. If you are interested in serving on this committee, please contact Jennifer, before she starts knocking on doors. Please consider how YOU could help share the work within our guild.

There was some question about whether members should be serving in more than one board position. I think this statement was including committee chairs as part of the board. This year there were several positions that were unfilled, and members who were already serving in one capacity graciously volunteered to step up and serve in a second position. Ideally, members would only have one job to concentrate on, but this year, has been different in so many ways.

Executive Board Meeting Discussion: It was brought to the board's attention after the last meeting, that several quilters were inquiring about selling their quilts at the quilt show. (Quilts in addition to the ones displayed as part of the show) After an executive board meeting and lengthy discussion, we decided that since the quilt show is our major fundraiser, having tables with members showing/selling their quilts directly to visitors might take away from the show. I realize that there is not a venue this year for selling your work, and perhaps the boutique could be reinstated for the next show if there is interest from many members. And of course, help in organizing it.

For this reason, we will not be selling Kathy Rivenbark's quilts. Although finishing these quilts has been a labor of love, selling the quilts at our show is not really the right venue and it sets a precedent for others to sell items without a benefit to the guild. Karen, Joanna and Martha are working to sell the quilts in other ways and being able to send the proceeds to Kathy's family.

Western North Carolina Quilt guild is having their show from March 29-31. Classes and sewing machine cleaning will be offered. March 4 is deadline for signup.

Committees:

Retreat: Carol Johnson has maps and info if needed.

Quilt Show: Sandy Wolf advised that we will have large potted plants and the end of rows, to prevent tripping. These plants will be for sale at the end of the show. Sandy asks that workers park in the grass area, or at Morningside Church across the road, to maximize parking for visitors. At this time, the kitchen is not available, but there will be snacks and food platters for workers and vendors. Quilt drop off is from 8-11am Thursday! Committees can set up at noon. Pickup is at 4:30pm on Saturday.

Hostess: Hazel Abend introduced new member, Betty Clouse, and visitors, Pat Getsinger, Susan Jozwick, Teresa Sparks, and Kathy Stokes.

Philanthropy: Paula Bryan reminded about the monthly workshop on March 12 at CQS. She showed a quilt made from blocks by Elinor Goss.

Guild Sales: Tami Grabowski described guild sales for new members and visitors.

Refreshments: Betty Cirillo thanked March birthday members for the good selection tonight.

Challenge Quilt: Suzanne Brehm directed members to vote on their favorite quilt during the break.

Block of the Month: Ruth Bartholomew advised that next month's block will be #23, and colors will be crayon box red and white. Linda Harper won tonight's blocks and the project bag!

Education: Sue Burton suggested using a baby monitor to keep track of progress of your embroidery machine without having to sit with it. She suggested soaking cutting mats in the tub and drying and storing them flat for longer life. If the front of your mat is developing cutting lines, just turn it over – brand new! Sue reminded all to remember to lock their rotary cutters each time they set them down. For those who don't, she recommended that they wear fleece lined booties to soak up the blood when the cutters fall!

Show and Share: Projects were shared by Hazel Abend, Melanie DeMoise, Dale Hernandez, Suzanne Brehm, Martha White, and Kathy Stokes.

BOM April - BLOCK QUEST

This year, we will be using the patterns from the Fat Quarter Shop, "Sewcialites". I have contacted the Fat Quarter Shop to ask permission for this use, and they said we could use the patterns, but that the patterns could not be printed for hand outs, or in the newsletter. The patterns are free to download from their website:

<https://www.fatquartershop.com/free-quilt-patterns/sewcialites-free-pattern-series>

The block that we are using for the March block quest is the Block 23 pattern, "Steadfast". <https://www.fatquartershop.com/sewcialites-block-twentythree-steadfast-free-pdf> The patterns come in three sizes: 9", 6", and 3". The chosen colors for this month are red and white. Choose a crayon-box red fabric as the "print" and white as the background color. Make as many blocks as you want, in whatever size you want. For each completed block you turn in at the April 2022 meeting, you will get one entry to win all of the submitted blocks.

As an added incentive in the block of the month, I am also having a drawing to win a project bag that I have created - so, if you don't win the blocks, you may win the bag!

Each month another block will be chosen from the remaining blocks, and the colors will be chosen randomly from the color combos that were given to me at the July 2021 meeting. I will make the next blocks and have them ready to be shown at the April meeting.

If you do not have access to a computer, phone a friend, or let me know. I will get a pattern to you.

BOM April - TIPS & TRICKS



Cut the red square first (3.5", 2.5" or 1.5"). Then, rather than cut the remaining squares, cut a strip of red AND white the width of the square (2", 1.5" or 1") by this length: 18" for 3" block, 22" for the 6" block, 30" for the 9" block (these are my mathematical estimates, no guarantees). Shorten your stitch length, then sew strips together lengthwise. Press your

strips with seam to the red side. Then, cut 4 rectangle lengths (3.5", 2.5" or 1.5") and then 8 square units (2", 1.5" or 1"). Then assemble the block according to the diagram. This technique will make this block go together much faster!

Programs & Workshops

Programs - As the guild offers classes, I am sharing the classes registrations with other guilds and keeping the class registration cost down per person. This year we have been fortunate to include our area Upstate guilds and have been able to fill the class and cover the teacher expenses. FPQG is first to register, and we want to share the experience with other guilds to not only fill our classes but build new relations and meet new people. If you want to get to know guild members, I suggest you register for a class and you will be delighted the new relationships you will build. Hope to see you at a class soon.

April Lecture - Veronica Moriarty

Veronica Moriarty is our speaker on April 5th and her program will be "What a Pile of Scraps". She is a "little bit of everything" quilter who recently retired after spending over 40 years as a clinical pharmacist in Spartanburg. Veronica says most quilters have some leftover fabric – usually a LOT of leftover fabric. Do you toss the leftover scraps in a pile with others, or do you organize those leftovers by color or size? Is your scrap pile taking over your creative space? Whether you have a small or an overwhelming scrap pile, Veronica will give you some tips on organization so you can gain some control over the leftovers. She has multiple examples of quilts you can easily make without spending any money on fabric.

Veronica arrived at quilting as a hobby having had no experience whatsoever in needle arts. Although no one in her family sewed or quilted, she decided to make a quilt in 1986. Despite early quilt failures (some might be termed disasters) she persisted and now spends most days quilting, playing with her dog, and hiking with her husband (but mostly quilting). She has won many ribbons in a variety of shows, and has had quilts juried into Paducah multiple time and the International Quilt Festival in Houston. She is active in her local guild as well as Quilters of South Carolina, where she serves as Ways and Means chairperson. She lives in the mountains of North Carolina with her husband John and is mom to three grown children and grandmother to five grand dogs.



Veronica will be teaching "Improvisation with Scraps" class on April 23rd from 9:30 am to 4:00 pm. The class will teach you to use leftover strips and scraps, students will make "new" fabric

that can then be used in the quilt making process. Various prompts will be given to help students let go of rules and discover ways to let their creativity out. FPQG members voted at the last meeting and the picture below of the circle scrap won. Cost for the class is \$25.

May Lecture - Marti Michell

Our guest speaker for May will be the well-known Marti Michell with her presentation on "Machine Quilting in Sections." Marti will also teach a full day "Kaleidoscope Creations" class on Wednesday, May 4th.

It is no wonder that Marti Michelle is often introduced as a pioneer in the current quilt revival. In fact, in 1972 when Marti and her husband Richard started Yours Truly, Inc., a patchwork kit company, there was no quilt industry. Since then, she has contributed in almost every capacity. A popular teacher, Marti travels extensively, having now taught in 49 states and 26 countries. Look through your library of quilting books and you'll surely find one of Marti's books. At last count, nearly 1.75 million books authored by Marti have been sold. Likewise, you undoubtedly have fabric, patterns, or tools that she has designed in your collected sewing materials. Since 1995, the Michells have manufactured the From Marti Michell line of acrylic templates and specialty rulers for rotary cutting.

Furthermore, Marti's influence in the quilting industry is enormous. During the Yours Truly years, 1972-85, Marti "discovered", and she and Richard published and promoted into early prominence, quiltmaker/author/teacher personalities such as Marianne Fons, Liz Porter, Harriet Hargrave, Mary Ellen Hopkins, Jean Wells, Susan McKelvey, and Cheryl Bradkin. Marti is the recipient of three prestigious quilt industry "lifetime achievement" awards, The Silver Star (2004) and the Michael Kile Award (1991) and more recently, the Quilter's Hall of Fame in 2020.

Whether she is participating as a teacher, quilter, author, publisher, manufacturer, designer, consultant, judge or quilt collector, her enthusiasm for and love of quilting is always evident. Marti and Richard live in Atlanta, GA, but she was born and raised in Iowa. She received a B.S. in Textiles and Clothing and Home Ec Journalism from Iowa State University.

Marti will also teach a full day "Kaleidoscope Creations" class on Wednesday, May 4th. Marti's website line to her Kaleidoscope ABCs book cover will give you many pictures of beautiful quilts. https://frommarti.com/products/kaleidoscope-abc?_pos=1&psq=kaleidoscope&ss=e&v=1.0 This will be a technique class and the supply list is extremely simplistic. The cost for the class is \$25 and that is a bargain for a National Teacher and Quilter's Hall of Fame member.

It eliminates making templates, simplifies accurate cutting and can be used for many different size blocks. The ruler is laser-cut from thick acrylic for rotary cutting. Best of all, Marti supplies the Kaleido-Rulers™ for you to use in class and they may be purchased if desired.
