

## 3-Yard Quilt Patterns

Three-yard quilt patterns are a great option to know about, especially if you are a new quilter or are looking for something quick to make. As the name suggests, you need 3, one-yard cuts of coordinating fabric. An easy way to select the fabrics is to buy one yard of a feature or focus fabric, then buy two coordinating fabrics, such as a tone-on-tone print, polka dots, or a small print – and you will need one yard of **each** of the coordinates for a total of 3 yards. This is enough fabric to make your quilt top and a scrappy binding cut 2 ½” wide. You will also need fabric for your backing. Below are three resources with a free 3-Yard quilt pattern, and you may also want to check Pinterest where you may find other patterns and ideas for these quilts!
